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Prosody for all the skills: How to integrate the "music" of language into any lesson



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Prosody is the "music" of language, including intonation, pitch, and rhythm. While sometimes mentioned in speaking activities, it is often overlooked in language teaching. Growing evidence shows prosody is important on many levels. It plays a major role in listening comprehension, and it is important in sentence processing in reading, even when reading silently!
