

Mechanics of sound production?

- L1 interference

e.g.: The $/\theta/$ sound does not exist in Mandarin and Cantonese. The /s/ or the /f/ sounds come in as an alternative. Sometimes it results in senentences such as "He's 'sinking'.



Distinguishing between different speech sounds?



Distinguishing between different speech sounds?

- Additional sounds

e.g.: This may be a tricky thing for Brazilian Portuguese learners, for example, as it is quite challenging for them to notice differences in minimal pairs like:

/p/ and /b/ ('pig' and 'big')







Limiting mispronunciations caused by accent?



Limiting the way a non-native English speaker manages the language with a so-called holier-than-thou model to be followed and accepted may cause nothing but a fear of being ridiculed and mocked.


